## Camp Descriptions

### Kiddie Kamp (3 and 4 years of age) 7am-5:30pm

This camp program consists of daily swim time, arts and crafts, story time, playtime, nature walks, pre-school activities, and special guests! Children must be fully toilet-trained.

Y Members: \$85/week, Non Member: \$105/week, Siblings: \$15 off each

### Traditional Camp (5 through 9 years of age) 7am-5:30pm

This camp provides campers with a variety of fun and exciting activities. Activities include, daily swimming, nature activities, gym games, crafts, camp songs, special guests, and optional local field trips. Campers are divided into age appropriate groups.

Y Members: \$85/week, Non Member: \$105/week, Siblings: \$15 off each sibling.

### Camp Tween (10 through 12 years old) 7am-5:30pm

This camp is for EXPERIENCED CAMPERS ONLY. Campers will have a hand in planning the activities each day, so there is guaranteed to be something for everyone! Activities throughout the day include swimming, gym time, and weekly summer projects.

Y Members: \$85/week, Non Member: \$105/week, Siblings: \$15 off each sibling.

### Specialty & Sports Camps

Space is limited in these camps and spots fill up quick! There are a variety of camps to choose from changing weekly and camps are either half or full day. For camps that are only half day, campers can stay for a full day for an additional \$25 per week. Sibling discounts are not available for these camps however if you have a sibling registered for the same week in above camps discount will apply to them.

### CIT Camp (Ages 13 through 15) 7am-5:30pm

Counselors In Training, will allow participants to learn all of the behind the scene action that goes into camp. Throughout the summer CIT's will design their own summer camp and work with the different YMCA directors to do so. CIT's will be partnered up with Lead Counselors and assist campers throughout the day. All work and no play? CIT's will get their own time throughout the day to swim, hang out, shoot hoops, or exercise in the fitness center.

Y Members: \$25/week, Non Member: \$35/week. If there is a sibling in this category there is no discount.

### Swim Lessons for Campers

Swim lessons during camp days are opened to everyone except those in Sports or Specialty Camps (because you may be off-site). Lessons will take place Monday through Thursday.

Drop-off: for all camps (except Specialty and Sports camps) are from 7:00-8:30am.

Pick-up: for all camps (except Specialty and Sports camps) goes from 4:30-5:30pm.

Specialty & Sports Camps: Please follow exact times on previous pages, if you would like to drop-off your child any earlier than the noted time, or pick your child up any time after posted time you will need to pay for Extra Hours, and/or Evening Hours.

Evening Hours: Evening hours are offered from 5:30—7pm Monday through Friday for an additional \$20 per week per child.
